**NATIONAL SECURITY AND FOREIGN RELATIONS (NSFR) , Jan Ekert**

Well there is a whole lot going on in this world of our. Please keep all of our Troops in your prayers. From the National Security Director this past month I have gotten the brief that comes from National. A few highlights -DHS funding with the current lapse in funding due to the budget stand-off a concern with any shut down that the American Legion has had related to the Coast Guard and their being paid. At the present time the Coast Guard is getting paid, but government civilians are not. The conflict in Iran has resulted in 300 Service Members have been wounded, and 13 have been killed, sine February 28. Per the Department of War the Veteran Suicide rates appear top have decrease some, but remember "BE THE ONE" 1 Veteran Suicide is 1 to many.

**Baseball Chairman - Joe Dollerschell**

Registrations for the 2026 American Legion baseball season here in Minnesota is nearly complete. As of now it is going to be another banner year for the baseball program in our great state, and for District 7. Minnesota has topped 400 registered teams for this season, and we may very well not be finished yet. That is an all-time high number of teams. No other state in the union comes even close to that number. Clearly your efforts in sponsoring this great program are having a huge impact on young men in our district.

Today I can report that there are 41 teams registered that are based in our district. Breaking that down we see:

- 3 division 1 junior teams
- 16 division 2 junior teams.
- 3 division 1 senior teams
- 19 division 2 senior teams.

\$150,000 for veterans rated by the VA at 70 to 100 percent disabled. The second level provides an exclusion of \$300,000 in value for veterans rated 100 percent permanent and total. House File 3727 raises the amounts to \$225,000 and \$450,000 respectively. Its companion is Senate File 615.

We ask state lawmakers to approve these bills and show their respect for the sacrifices the most disabled veterans have endured. Without them, we wouldn't have a Minnesota to govern.

**Priority 2:**

Help the Department of Minnesota advocate on behalf of charitable gambling operations in Minnesota. We want to see meat raffles (i.e.: paddle tickets) go to a \$5 cap, instead of \$2, with a \$500 prize limit, instead of \$70. We also want to see tax relief for charities should a sports-betting bill pass the Legislature.

**Priority 3:**

Make the Minnesota Commanders' Task Force some sort of official entity, whether that is a nonprofit organization or a child of the state government. For many decades it has existed in a quasi-limbo state. The Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs and the CTF hopes to change that this session.

Regular season play commences right after the high school season ends. For most teams, this means we get under way around the 1<sup>st</sup> week of June. Playoffs begin typically the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of July and end with state tournaments in 5 divisions, either the 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> weekend of August. In 2026, one state tournament will be hosted by a District 7 team. That will be the Division 2 Senior tournament hosted by the Glenwood/Lowry team at Minnewaska High School from July 30-August 2. The organizers there have been building up to what I know will be a fantastic event. I encourage you all as American Legion members to try to attend some or all of the games there.
